A Bissel Torah From Our Rabbah

As we do at this time every year, our Torah journey takes us from the end of Breishit (the book of Genesis) to the beginning of Shmot (the book of Exodus). THIS is the moment that

For me, the UnShul continues to be a place of deep learning and meaning where I feel renewed and restored, seen and uplifted. What are your places and who are your

embodies our High Holy Day theme. Genesis is the Gestation story of the people Israel and Exodus is both our birthing and our liberation story.

You can see the multiplication of our cells in Genesis. At first we are only Avram and Sarai and by the time Jacob travels down to Egypt we are dozens and dozens strong. You can see the cohesion and definition of our characteristics shift from the amorphous and unsure (perhaps embryonic) first parents who made so many questionable decisions in their dealings with rulers of other people and with Hagar and Ishmael to the coalescence of spiritual power, practical wisdom and righteousness we see in Joseph as he fends off famine and forgives the unforgivable his brothers. From with undetermined mass of cells to a fully formed and perhaps even awakened being, ready to start a new way of being.

But birthing is hard. It is hard for us, and it was hard for our ancestors. We do not move from a state of cohesion to a state of spectacular freedom and power. We learn that we must journey through a long and devastating period of degradation. Over 400 years of slavery before we can show up as empowered humans.

As we leave Breishit and enter

For me as I recall the flipping of 40 Congressional seats into the hands of those who share Torah's values of compassion and welcoming the immigrant and ensuring that all can eat and have health care, I see enormous potential.

I am heartened and inspired and S000 grateful to the many organizations who are coalescing to shift the tide and prepare the way for birthing a new kind of nation, including the Portland Spirit Led Justice Alliance which I hope you will all join! I also see the ongoing treatment of children seeking refuge in our country, the militarized response of what some are calling the Exodus of people coming to our borders and I know that we are nowhere near birthed vet.
